- All entries must be the pupils' original work and not plagiarised wholly or in part; work entered must be pupils' own but may be aided/guided by a teacher.

- All individuals working on a project must be registered pupils in a Primary or Special School, and between the ages of 8 and 13 (7 to 18 in Special Schools). We welcome entries from Special Schools, and judges will take into consideration that these are Special School entries.
- Schools may submit multiple entries. For each entry, please ensure it is accompanied by a completed entry form with a teacher/guardian signature.
- Short-listed entrants may be asked to provide proof of age and to confirm the authenticity of their submission.
- Irish Aid and Real Nation reserve the right to alter entries as necessary to ensure accuracy and maintain formatting requirements and/or consistency for print/promotional/broadcast purposes.
- The judges and sponsoring organisation will not enter into correspondence with regard to the decision of the judges for all competition entries; national awards will be final.
