- 2. By submitting an entry for the competition, the entrant hereby acknowledges and agrees that the entry and any subsequent images may be featured in an online magazine and/or reproduced and broadcast (in whole or in part) on media and social channels for various promotional and/or educational purposes.
- All entries must be the pupils' original work and not plagiarised wholly or in part; work entered must be pupils' own but may be aided/guided by a teacher.
- 4. By signing this form the teacher/guardian takes responsibility of ensuring consent for the distribution/use of any entries and/or images submitted as outlined herein.
- 5. All individuals working on a project must be registered pupils in a Primary or Special School, and between the ages of 8 and 13 (7 to 18 in Special Schools). We welcome entries from Special Schools, and judges will take into consideration that these are Special School entries.
- 6. Schools may submit multiple entries. For each entry, please ensure it is accompanied by a completed entry form with a teacher/guardian signature.
- 7. Short-listed entrants may be asked to provide proof of age and to confirm the authenticity of their submission.
- 8. Irish Aid and Real Nation reserve the right to alter entries as necessary to ensure accuracy and maintain formatting requirements and/or consistency for print/promotional/broadcast purposes.
- The judges and sponsoring organisation will not enter into correspondence with regard to the decision of the judges for all competition entries: national awards will be final.
